
Update from Hannah

Before Christmas our youth groups focused on different influences in our lives and looking at what God had to say about each of these. This term we are diving theologically deeper as we consider the nature of God through the book of Exodus.

In the first week we looked at Shiphrah and Puah, the Hebrew midwives, and saw how they disobeyed Pharaoh and instead relied on God.

My personal highlight of this term has been getting new Bibles specifically for the young people in our youth groups. At the very first youth group where they were used a young person was so excited that they went home and told their parents all about it. They had previously quizzed me about what made these Bibles specifically youth Bibles and what the footnotes were all about.

As always we have lots of fun and even learnt about some different phobias as part of a quiz!

Youthinc is a charity entirely supported by donations from local parishes in South Cambridgeshire. It is our vision that every young person has the opportunity to meet with a Christian youth worker and link up with their local church.

'Youth' starts early nowadays. Since we started 7 years ago we have become increasingly aware that as pupils reach the top classes in primary schools they have big questions and are keen to engage in challenging discussions, as well as sharing fun, food and friendship which can sustain them as they move on to secondary school.

The cost of a youth worker for two days a week is about £15,000 pa. YOUTHINC trustees are currently sending our letters and emails to all parishes in Granta Deanery to ask them to prayerfully consider how much they can contribute to this valuable ministry. For almost any book or topic in the Bible you can find a video overview, podcasts and articles on the Bible Project website.
