## INFORMAL CHURCH SERVICE AROUND A CAMPFIRE WITH YOUTH ACTIVITIES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE IN SCHOOL YEARS 4-8

## Update on our partners Cambridge & District Youth for Christ

Youthinc employs Hannah, our youth worker, in partnership with Cambridge and District Youth for Christ(YFC). Their Catalyst programme aims to increase the capacity of churches to link up with local young people and their families For the last seven years they have helped us recruit youthworkers, no mean feat when there are very few around. They also provide professional support and training, support that we can't provide within Granta Deanery. Hannah currently works two days for us. At the moment she leads groups in Sawston, Hinkledux and Sawston and plans joint events.

Mark Watson, centre director, is her line manager supporting her, and us, with prayer, wisdom and practical advice. He succeeds Jim Overton who has recently moved on after many years of amazing mission.

She is also part of the core team in the Cambridge office on St Andrews Street. She writes and delivers mentoring in secondary schools, and helps run the innovative CAFE no40 ... a safe place for teenagers to have a coffee, chat, socialise and learn life skills. You might pass it on St Andrews street, just opposite Emmanuel College.

## Supporting YOUTHINC in your parishes

Youthinc is a charity entirely supported by donations from local parishes in South Cambridgeshire. It is our vision that every young person has the opportunity to meet with a Christian youth worker and link up with their local church.

‘Youth’ starts early nowadays. Since we started 7 years ago we have become increasingly aware that as pupils reach the top classes in primary schools they have big questions and are keen to engage in challenging discussions, as well as sharing fun, food and friendship which can sustain them as they move on to secondary school.

The cost of a youth worker for two days a week is about £16,000 pa. YOUTHINC trustees are currently sending our letters and emails to all parishes in Granta Deanery to ask them to prayerfully consider how much they can contribute to this valuable ministry.
